January Meeting – Ikebana



We were fortunate to have Yohko Ogami and her assistant, demonstrating beginning Ikebana flower arrangements for us. Both are members of the O'Hara School of Ikebana.

Yohko showed us a rising form or hanaisho arrangement. In this design, the flowers are held in a kenzon, or frog, that is placed in the center of a shallow bowl.

In creating the artful designs of Ikebana, the length and placement of stems is exact. Quadrants in the bowl or tall vase are carefully measured. The degree of incline or rise of the stems has been determined long ago. Yet the type of design, the decision of how best to place the stems, is determined only when the flower or branch has been respectfully examined.

The arrangements combined many materials – one was acacia, tulips, lemon leaves, and freesia. Another was nandina, lily and pine and forsythia.

February Meeting – water wise gardening

For contrast, they used Grevillea or grasses, such as Muehlenbeckia. They invited us to SCBG to see a new area they have planted near the entrance.

Landscape of the Month

February's Landscape Award was presented to Gloria L. Gilmore at 115 Via Monte d'Oro.

This is a lovely curbside garden that bursts with color and nicely frames a half moon driveway. Centered around a stately olive tree are a lush planting of iceberg roses, pansies, raphiolepis, dwarf snapdragons and artichokes. Through the entry gate are spectacular, specimen size ornamental cabbages.

March's Landscape Award was presented to Mike Terre at 314 Calle de Arboles.

This is a lovely, mature landscape with some different horticulture. The slope is covered with a beautiful blue ceanothus, "Yankee Point". Ceanothus, also known as California lilac, is a native plant. A spectacular Magnolia soulangiana (Saucer Magnolia) was in full bloom until the winds blew all the magnificent pink blossoms away. Masses of pink Germalton Waxflower hover gracefully above the upper slope to the left of the driveway. A dwarf Japanese maple is nestled into the entry porch shrubbery. All in all, this is a landscape full of interesting variety and texture.
