January 2011 Landscape Award



Anne O'Brien & Jack, 416 Calle de Castellano

Appropriately, homeowner Anne O'Brien, an aviatrix, lives in an "airplane house." In architectural terms, it is technically a Mid Century Modern (or International Style Post and Beam Contemporary). The roof line echoes the lines of an airliner. These clean lined modern homes are popular in the Riviera.

After buying her home ten years ago, Anne began a remodel and re-landscaping that would carefully enhance the original architect's intentions. She took landscape classes and educated herself about drought tolerant and ocean friendly gardens.

She also created a Wildlife Habitat (note the sign in her front yard). Dramatic poured-in-place concrete steps lead up to the outdoor porch she refashioned into an outdoor room.

Pampas Grass & Other Invasive Plants. There are many reasons to avoid planting invasive plants, including: the crowding out of native plants, insects and animals; clogged waterways, etc. Invasive plants, such as Pampas Grass, is a leading threat to biodiversity. (See **www.plantright.org**)
