

The Beach Club was imposing and beautiful with a double curving stairway leading to the beach below the bluff.
Original Riviera home owners received membership to the Club with a 75' pool, tennis courts and dining facilities. The Beach Club became the place to spot celebrities in the early days (Cary Grant rode his horse on the beach) and a hot spot for local social events. (The Club later fell into disrepair and sadly burned down in the 1950's. The former club site has become Miramar Park (at the end of Calle Miramar) which sits above a stretch of beach called "Burnout" by the locals.)
