



The Color Purple—RGC's Delphinium Project-

Please plant Delphinium (or Larkspur) for our Historic House Tour! Plant them in light-weight terra cota looking plastic pots to transport to our Hospitality House on May 31, the afternoon before our first Tour day, June 1. This is the official Torrance City Flower. We would like these beautiful plants to be blooming all over the place in honor of our Centennial event. If every RGC Club Member plants SEVERAL pots we should have quite a showing! Armstrong Nursery on Crenshaw in Torrance is holding a big supply for us (you DON'T HAVE to buy them there). Right now, 6 packs are \$2.99. If you can't plant now, plant larger plants closer to the Tour date. Please mark name underneath pot if you want it back after the Tour.

<u>WARNING: The Delphinium (& Larkspur) are highly toxic plants!</u> Never mix food, children & plants without knowing what is and what is not toxic. Even the leaf of a tomato plant and the apple seed are toxic. AND, the most toxic plant of them all is the Oleander—which is planted all around school yards and roadways across America! We gave out a list of toxic plants at the RGC February General Meeting. Call Karen if you would like a copy.
