Compliance Corner By George Unrine Tax Deductions

After incorporation last year, the Riviera Garden Club applied to convert its **group** tax exempt status Section 501(c)3 to **individual** tax exempt status Section 501(c)3. If our application is successful, which we believe it should be, the new status should be retroactive to July 12, 2012, and dues and contributions paid after incorporation will be tax deductible.

Before incorporation, RGC was under the CGCI group and those dues and contributions are deductible. However, we may not receive official confirma-

tion of the new status (and tax deductibility) from the Internal Revenue Service until later, so you should consult with your tax advisor as to how to handle such items in preparing your 2012 individual income tax returns.
