Miramar is the newest of the nine national veterans cemeteries located in California. Palomar District was honored that Andrea Little, National Garden Club Blue Star Memorials Chairman, and Rita Desilets, CGCI President were in attendance. George Speer planned the installation and coordinated the dedication ceremony. Installation of the marker was done by Chris Abeyta as his Eagle Scout project and the color guard was provided by Scripps Ranch High School. Hollywood Riviera Homeowners Association Meeting

Residents of the Riviera recently heard about expected impacts anticipated from the new Legado Development (at the old Bristol Farms site) on PCH & Palos Verdes Blvd.

As proposed, the 4-story project would contain 180-rental units (including 9 lowincome ones), plus the 110-rooms at Palos Verdes Inn, plus almost 40,000 sq. feet of retail / commercial space. It's clear the underground parking spaces will not be nearly sufficient to accommodate all resident, hotel, retail and employee capacity needs.

The association and its members will continue to track and comment on this project as it moves forward.
