
PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

JARDIN DE BOTANICO DE VALLARTA

Sixteen miles south of central Puerto Vallarta, tucked away in the hills north of El Tuito, is where you will find Jardin Botanico Vallarta (JBV). I have been a supporter of these gardens since 2012. The property has many paths that will take you through its lush gardens. This includes, but not limited to, native orchids, bromeliads, succulents, cactus, and other interesting plants. As a plant nursery owner I have been supporting JBV evolving into a matured exhibit of natural flowers and fauna.

In 2014, I went for a visit with handfuls of seeds from one of our lantana plants. Robert Price, Curator, spread them throughout the main path from the entrance to the main hacienda. I have returned on numerous occasions, and I watch as our lantana grows. A part of WaterWise Garden Center (WWGC) still lives on! I was there this past October, and the lantana has grown into tremendous bushes. I look forward to seeing the progress on my journeys there in 2020.

There are pavilions for rhododendrons, orchids, succulents, and tropical plants. In 2014, the rhododendron pavilion was completed. It houses a variety of exotic orchids and other exotic plants. In 2018, the pavilion for cactus was opened. Mounds of lava rock make are base of the cactus gardens.

In the exotic plant pavilion there is a sterile lab that house hundreds of sprouting orchids and other exotics. Before the lab was up and running, Robert showed me the layout and plans he had for cultivating native plants. The lab is now filled with sprouts and young adult plants.

Robert built a small chapel that can seat 24-ish people. The magnificence of the structure and the path to it is a work of art. Behind the chapel is a small area that pays homage to the gardens' founder Betty Price.

With comfortable facilities I always have a siesta after lunch. The view from the lounging area is magnificent with lush mountains as a backdrop and running rivers flowing during the wet season.

The hacienda houses an open-air multipurpose room for large events. There is a large gift shop of for those who enjoy talavera and other Mexican artisan gifts. Upstairs is a lovely open-air restaurant that is surrounded with hummingbird feeders that attract many colorful hummingbirds. A wooden tray sitting just below is full of fruits and nuts to feed a variety of colorful birds and squirrels. The menu has a good variety, and the food is always delicious.



If you enjoy botanical gardens, and you are interested in taking a day trip in the Puerto Vallarta area, I highly recommend a visit to Jardin Botanical Vallarta. As a local grower of cactus, succulents, and orchids, I am overwhelmed at the plethora of native and exotic plants that grow there.
